Sealed with our Seals. Dated the *Eighteenth* Day of *August* Anno Domini, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty five* Annoque Regni Regis *Georgii Secundi Vice primo Anno.*

The Condition of this present Obligation is such, That if the above-bounden *John Codman* this day admitted Administrator of the Estate of his Father *W^m John Codman* late of *Charlestown* aforesaid Deceased shall
