Know all Men by these presents, That we *John Codman Gent^{man} Richard Codman Gent^{man} both Charles Town in the County of Middlesex and Ben^{jamin} Sparrow of the County of Boston in the County of Suffolk Massachusetts 200* within his Majesty's Province of the Massachusetts-Bay in New-England, are holden and stand firmly bound and obliged unto *Samuel Danforth Esq^r* Judge of Probate of Wills, and granting Administrations within the County of *Middlesex* in the full and just Sum of *five hundred Pounds*, Lawful Money of the Province of the Massachusetts-Bay; to be paid unto the said *Samuel Danforth* or his Successors in the said Office, or Assigns: To the true Payment whereof, we bind our selves and each of us, our, and each of our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally for the whole and in the whole firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals. Dated the *Eighteenth* Day of *August* Anno Domini, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty five* Annoque Regni Regis *Georgii Secundi Vice primo Anno.*

The Condition of this present Obligation is such, That if the above-bounden *John Codman* this day admitted Administrator of the Estate of his Father *W^m John Codman* late of *Charlestown* aforesaid Deceased shall

do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels Rights and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the Hands, Possession or Knowledge of him the said *John Codman* or into the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Court of Probate for the said County of *Middlesex* at or before the *Eighteenth* Day of *November* next ensuing; and the same Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits, and all other the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said deceased, at the time of his Death which at any Time after shall come to the Hands and Possession of the said *John Codman* or into the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him do well and truly Administer according to Law: And further do make, or cause to be made a just and true Account of his said Administration upon Oath, at or before the *Eighteenth* Day of *August* which will be in the Year of our Lord, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty five* And all the rest and residue of the said Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrator's Account (the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being, of Probate of Wills and granting Administrations within the County of *Middlesex* aforesaid) and shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said Judge or Judges by his, or their Decree or Sentence pursuant to Law shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the Court of Probate for the said County of *Middlesex* making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly: If the said *John Codman* above within bounden being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letter of Administration (Approval of such Testament being first had and made) into the said Court: Then the before Written Obligation to be Void and of none Effect, or else to abide and remain in full Force and Virtue.
